### PIPELINE UPDATES



### Jubilee KEB Apartments

DC Green Bank closed on \$3 million in financing to support the delivery of 18 units of affordable housing for returning citizens. The building will be all-electric, including a community kitchen that will offer workforce training. The property will also include rooftop solar and achieve Enterprise Green Communities Certification Plus.

- Projected Project Impacts:
  - 18 units of affordable housing for returning citizens
  - 21,000 kWh generated from the rooftop solar system
  - Annual emissions reduction the equivalent of more than 32,000 miles driven by car
- Wards Impacted: Ward 1

## First Direct Lending and DC PACE Combined Deal Closing 715 Kennedy Street

This project is the first to join DC Green Bank direct lending and DC PACE Program financing. \$3.1 million in total financing will support the construction of eight new, affordable homes in Ward 4. DC Green Bank provided \$1.9 million in direct lending and the DC PACE Program — via PACE Equity — unlocked \$1.2 million in private finance. The development will include solar panels, a green roof, energy efficient insulation, high-efficiency HVAC, lighting, and water-saving fixtures.



- Total Project Size: \$3.1MM
- Projected Project Impacts:
  - Enterprise Green Communities Certification Plus
  - 8 affordable units
  - Cut annual utility costs by \$10,000
  - Dozens of construction jobs
- Wards Impacted: Ward 4





## DC PACE Deal Closing 1337 Pennsylvania Avenue SE


PACE Equity closed on \$1.1 million in financing through the DC PACE Program for a 20-unit residential property in SE. The financing will be used for the installation of solar panels, improved insulation, LED lighting, and water-efficient fixtures.

- Projected Project Impacts:
  - \$20,000 in annual energy and water savings.
  - Estimated 71,000 kWh annual reduction in electricity usage.
  - Creation of 98 construction jobs.
- Wards Impacted: Ward 6


